



## **Behaviour Policy June 2020**

In these unprecedented times, it is important that Seaford Head School is a safe and calm environment for all students. Therefore, it is essential that all students follow the rules of the school and that the school has high expectations of behaviour for learning and student conduct. The school will continue to focus on praising students and rewards. The students will receive, house points, Postcard points, Book of Excellence points and Star of the week for following the school ethos (respect for all, honest and kind intentions, positive contributions, hard work and a can-do attitude). Parents can see their child's rewards through the Edulink app

### **General Rules and procedures**

- 1) To wear clean clothes each day. These clean clothes should be comfortable and appropriate for school (such as no crop tops, very short skirts or shorts)
- 2) To arrive at your allotted time and arrive at school being socially distant ( 2 metres) away from another child
- 3) Throughout the school day respect the 2-metre social distance rule
- 4) To only go to your allotted classroom/space
- 5) To only leave your allotted space with a teacher's permission. Teachers will only allow one child to go to leave the classroom at any point.
- 6) Students must wash and sanitise their hands when they enter and exit the site and regularly throughout the day when asked.
- 7) Students are expected to bring their own snack for break. Break will happen in the classroom or an allotted space and students must remain in that space using social distancing.
- 8) No child should enter the school with a temperature or Covid 19 symptoms (see the NHS website or Public Health England for Symptoms)

### **Learning environment rules**

- 1) Students must have their own equipment. No other child can share or lend equipment
- 2) To follow all staff instructions
- 3) Students are to have their mobile phone switched off during the school day
- 4) No chewing gum or eating during lesson times
- 5) To always speak in a respectful way to all staff and students
- 6) To listen to staff and students. There should only be one voice in the room
- 7) To attempt all work and to remain on task
- 8) If requiring assistance, students must raise their hand and wait for assistance. A member of staff will help. Do not go over to the member of staff for help.
- 9) To respect the 2 metres distance rule in class at all times, so all students and staff feel safe.

The school has a duty to protect all students and staff during these times. Therefore, there will be a zero-tolerance approach to those students failing to follow staff instructions regarding the above rules in the context of the learning environment and Students' and staff safety. The school will contact you and ask for your child to be collected or for you to allow your child to go home independently. The staff member will reinforce expectations if a student is to return.

In lessons, all students will be given a warning, and then a final warning. On the final warning, on call will be called. The pastoral staff will support a child to rectify their behaviour. The pastoral staff will be on site for welfare support.

To ensure the safety and well-being of our students and members of staff, we reserve the right to carry out searches without formal written consent, as directed in the new Education Act [September 2012]. These prohibited items include: cigarettes, alcohol, illegal drugs, stolen items, weapons or any other item the school deems could be considered harmful to a student.

The school also has the power to exclude and permanently exclude children. Students can be Permanently excluded for persistent breaches of the school rules, or a serious one- off incident, such as a serious assault, illegal substances, or possession of a weapon.
